

FHT FUNDED ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE








BY THE NUMBERS (April 1,2024 - March 31, 2025)





Connecting Our Communities

Creation of the "Community Connection" Newsletter



Now with **15 editions and counting**, the "Community Connections" newsletter continues to share key updates, health education, and community outreach highlights across the community.

Community Needs Assessments

Mental Health Community Needs Assessment in early 2024 Led to the **reimaging** of our **Mental Health Team**, ensuring services are aligned with local needs.

- Recruitment of two Registered Psychotherapists, a Mental Health Occupational Therapist and a Clinical Supervisor formed our team.
- Launched new group programs:
 - Coping Skills October 2024
 - Introduction to Mindfulness November 2024



2024 Healthcare Needs Assessment for the communities of Carleton Place and Beckwith

- Led by master's students from Simon Fraser University
- Gathered insights from key stakeholders and residents in both Carleton Place and Beckwith communities to shape future programming and services, access to care, and equity in local healthcare services.

Funding Opportunity

With the support from all three Family Health Organization, OVFHT participated in a multiorganizational proposal in response to the Interprofessional Primary Care Team's (IPCT) call for proposals that will focus on increasing patient attachment and access to a primary care team in the KOA (postal code) area.

The proposal, endorsed by the **Ottawa West Four Rivers Ontario Health Team**, was **submitted to Ontario Health for consideration**. There are 120 proposals and only 80 will be approved in this initial round. Successful proposals will be notified by summer 2025.

Another call for proposals is scheduled for September 2025.

Dr. Laura Santos Joins Almonte's Memory Clinic Team

What is Memory Clinic? An interdisciplinary team including a **Registered Nurse**, **Occupational Therapist**, **Pharmacist**, **Physician**, and **First Link Care Navigator from the Alzheimer's Society**. Together, they assess needs, support safety and function, provide diagnoses, review medications, and connect individuals and caregivers to community resources – working as a team to develop personalized treatment plans and referrals.

Collaboration with Mississippi River Health Alliance

We strengthened our relationship with the new President & CEO of Mississippi River Health Alliance.

New Gender Affirming Care (GAC) Program

Our commitment to strengthening our medical team continues through active ongoing physician recruitment, with focused efforts underway to fill key roles in both Almonte and Carleton Place.

- In Almonte, we are seeking permanent physicians for two Family Health Organization (FHO) practices currently supported by locum coverage.
- In Carleton Place, we are working to recruit three net-new FHO physicians to meet growing community needs and enhance access to primary care.

Leadership and Growth

At the **governance level**, new board members joined our **Board of Directors** this year, bringing diverse experience and fresh insight to support strong, forward-looking leadership. Our Board of Directors now has **six active community members**, along with one physician representation from both Almonte and Carleton Place.

Clinic Management

The Beckwith FHO successfully recruited a **Clinic Manager** for Carleton Place Location, strengthening site-level leadership and unity as we move into the new location.

LOOKING AHEAD...2025/26 PRIORITIES

As we continue to grow and evolve, the year ahead brings exciting milestones and meaningful progress across the organization:

New Leadership

Earlier this year, we successfully completed recruitment for a new Executive Director. We're pleased to welcome Ashley to our Team. Ashley will officially assume her role on July 7th as we begin this next chapter together.

Electronic Medical Record (EMR) Integration

The Carleton Place and Beckwith Family Health Organizations will merge onto a unified EMR system in July 2025, supporting more seamless care delivery and collaboration.

Joint Programs & Services Team

The newly integrated Programs & Services Team will hold its first meeting in July 2025, aligning care delivery and resource planning across sites.

NEST (Newborn and Early Postpartum Support Team) Program Continued development of the NEST Program will support unattached newborns and families in our community with a primary care provider, which will enhance early parenting and family wellness.

Expansion to the Carleton Place Regional Health Hub

We anticipate moving into our new shared space at 22 Costello Drive, Carleton Place in September 2025, creating a centralized, collaborative environment.

Patient Engagement Survey

A new wave of patient feedback will be collected in November 2025, ensuring our services reflect the evolving needs of those we serve.

- Continue to work with Ottawa West Four Rivers Ontario Health Team and Primary
 Care Network to coordinate attachment of patients to a primary care team including
 patients on the Health Care Connect waitlist (through new and expanded IPCTs).
- Continue our commitment to promoting equity, inclusion, diversity, and anti-racism education for all staff and providers, with the goal of creating a safe and inclusive environment for patients, partners and employees.

Strategic Planning Continuation

Our strategic planning process will resume in January 2026, guiding long-term priorities and community-focused innovation.
